

Request for Speaker Proposal

The 2021 Oregon State Academy of Nutrition & Dietetics Conference Planning Team is accepting speaker proposals. Scheduled for May 6-7, 2021 at the Embassy Suites near Portland International Airport, the conference will bring together an estimated 150-175 food and nutrition professionals. Note that we hope to have the meeting in person but will be prepared to move to virtual if needed.

Presentations will reflect cutting edge research and practical applications, with a special emphasis on interactive sessions (small group work, Q&A, other). Proposals are being accepted for general and concurrent sessions (May 7), as well as a pre-conference workshop(s) for May 6th.

Section I: General Guidelines

- All proposals are due on or before **September 10, 2020** by electronic submission to the e-mail address (and via the submission link) shown in Section IV.
- Only advanced sessions (Level II or III) in all suggested topic areas will be accepted. Category III submissions are preferred. Speakers must be seasoned professionals with demonstrated proficiency and excellence addressing audiences of up to 250 professionals (preferably).
 - **Category II:** Assumes that the participant has general knowledge of the literature and professional practice within the area(s) covered. The focus of the activity is to enhance knowledge and application by the participant.
 - **Category III:** Assumes that the participant has thorough knowledge of the literature and professional practice within the area(s) covered. The focus of the activity is synthesis of recent advances and future directions.
- Up to two (2) submissions per individual or group will be reviewed.
- Proposals from individuals who have not presented at previous Oregon educational conferences are encouraged.
- RDN speakers must be Academy members.
- A maximum of 3 speakers per session receive complimentary registration. You may propose more speakers, but speakers will be required to pay registration fees. Panel presentation of >2 people should be 1.5-hour sessions.
- All conflicts of interest and/or potential sponsorship must be fully disclosed at time of proposal submission.

Section II: Preferred Speaker Topics

The educational conference speaker selection committee is open to most topics under most learning codes (see above information regarding advanced sessions). Major topics that the convention planning team is seeking include:

The Program Committee is also open to proposals for a 3-to-4-hour preconference, to be offered on Thursday.

Section III: Evaluation Criteria

- Topic relevancy and cutting-edge or new information, the proposal's overall relevance to the identified topic areas, as well as importance and benefit to members.
- Applicant's experience in practice, research, and presenting on the proposed topic(s).

Section IV: Submission Requirements

Two steps are required for proposal submission:

1. Completed 2021 Conference Speaker Proposal Online Form [here](#).
2. Curriculum vitae, or bio and resume, for every proposed speaker.

Please limit curriculum vitae to four (4) pages maximum and email to oand@quidnunc.net. Your file name should be your last name with first initial – CV (jones,d – CV.doc).

The Educational Conference Planning Committee will begin discussions with proposed speakers in mid-to-late September. Notification of decision on all submissions will be sent via e-mail by no later than October 15, 2020.
